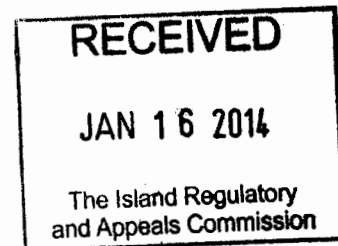

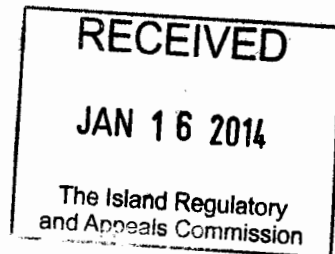

Renewable Energy Act Report – Section 3


I, John D. Gaudet, of Charlottetown, in Queens County, Province of Prince Edward Island, MAKE OATH AND SAY AS FOLLOWS:

1. I am the Vice President, Operations and Engineering for Maritime Electric Company, Limited (“MECL” or “the Company”), and as such have personal knowledge of the matters deposed to herein, except where noted, in which case I rely upon the information of others and in which case I verily believe such information to be true.
2. In my position with MECL, I have responsibility for, among other things, energy purchases and energy sales by the Company. During 2013 MECL sold a total of 1,126,989 MWh of electric energy. During 2013, MECL obtained 193,161 MWh of electric energy from renewable energy sources. In total, 17.1% of the Company’s electric energy sales were obtained from renewable energy sources for the calendar year 2013.
3. A chart detailing the various sources of the renewable energy obtained is attached as Exhibit “A”.
4. This report is prepared in accordance with section 3 of the *Renewable Energy Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-121.
