# Order

IN THE MATTER of an application by Superior Propane Inc. for a decrease of 1.6 cents per litre in its propane pricing schedule.

## **Order**

**UPON** the application of Superior Propane Inc. ("Superior") for a decrease of 1.6 cents per litre in all prices in its propane pricing schedule based on decreased acquisition costs;

**AND UPON** reading the Declaration of Michael Doyle, Market Manager for Superior, and supporting documentation filed herein on June 25, 2007;

**AND UPON** it appearing to the Commission that the prices resulting from a decrease of 1.6 cents per litre are just and reasonable;

**NOW THEREFORE**, pursuant to the *Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission Act* and the *Petroleum Products Act*,

#### IT IS ORDERED THAT

- 1. the maximum propane prices charged by Superior Propane Inc., effective 12:01 a.m. on Sunday, July 1, 2007, be in accordance with Appendix "A" to this Order, and shall remain in effect until otherwise ordered by the Commission; and
- **2.** the prices approved herein shall appear on all invoices covering sales or deliveries of propane.

#### NOTICE:

#### Section 58 of the Petroleum Products Act reads as follows:

- **58.** Where any person has the status of a party or is an intervenor in any hearing before the Commission, he is entitled
  - (a to appeal the decision of the Commission to the Appeal Division; and
  - (b) to participate as a party in the hearing of an appeal.

and an appeal shall be on a question of law or jurisdiction only and be governed by section 13 of the Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission Act.

### Sections 13.1 (1) and (2) of the Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission Act provide as follows:

- 13.(1) An appeal lies from a decision or order of the Commission to the Appeal Division of the Supreme Court upon a question of law or jurisdiction.
- (2) The appeal shall be made by filing a notice of appeal in the Supreme Court within twenty days after the decision or order appealed from and the Civil Procedure Rules respecting appeals apply with the necessary changes.
