**RE: Application for On-Island Capacity for Security of Supply Project
Commission Docket UE20742**

The Commission is proceeding to the next stage of its review of Maritime Electric Company, Limited's ("Maritime Electric") Application for additional On-Island generation capacity in Docket UE20742.

A public hearing will be held with respect to this Application. The public hearing will address the merits of Maritime Electric's proposed On-Island capacity solution. To ensure that this Application proceeds to a hearing as expeditiously as possible, the Commission has established the following procedural timelines:

1. Commission Staff and the Prince Edward Island Energy Corporation ("**PEIEC**"), as Added Party Intervener, will have the opportunity to ask Maritime Electric additional written interrogatories (questions). Commission Staff and PEIEC must deliver the interrogatories to Maritime Electric, with a copy to every other party, by no later than **4:00 p.m. on Friday, July 10, 2026**.

2. Maritime Electric must file its responses to the additional interrogatories, with a copy to all other parties, by no later than **4:00 p.m. on Friday, July 24, 2026**.
3. PEIEC, as Added Party Intervener, will have the opportunity to submit a pre-hearing written submission, including expert report(s). The pre-hearing written submission and expert reports (if any) must be delivered to every other party, and filed with the Commission, by no later than **4:00 p.m. on Friday, July 31, 2026**. Any expert report(s) must comply with Rule 58 of the Commission's *Rules of Practice & Procedure*.
4. The Friends of the Commission Interveners (Peter Bevan-Baker and Energy Democracy Now! Cooperative Limited) will each have the opportunity to submit a preliminary written submission. The preliminary written submissions must be delivered to every other party, and filed with the Commission, by no later than **4:00 p.m. on Friday, July 31, 2026**.
5. Maritime Electric, as Applicant, will have the opportunity to respond to the pre-hearing written submissions filed by PEIEC and the Friends of the Commission Interveners. Maritime Electric's response must be in writing, delivered to every other party, and filed with the Commission, by no later than **4:00 p.m. on Friday, August 7, 2026**.
6. Maritime Electric and PEIEC must provide their respective witness lists to the Commission, and the other parties, by **4:00 p.m. on Friday, August 14, 2026**. In accordance with Order UE25-03, the Friends of the Commission Interveners (Peter Bevan-Baker and Energy Democracy Now! Cooperative Limited) are not permitted to call witnesses at the public hearing, but will have the opportunity to make a verbal presentation.

As noted in Order UE25-03, to ensure that the hearing proceeds in a timely and efficient manner, the Commission may establish time limits for verbal presentations and the examination of witnesses.

7. Commission Staff and legal counsel have scheduled a pre-hearing conference for **Tuesday, August 18, 2026 beginning at 10:00 a.m.** The purpose of the pre-hearing conference is to discuss procedural matters in advance of the hearing. The pre-hearing conference will be conducted virtually using the Teams platform.
8. The public hearing will begin at **9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, August 25, 2026**, and will continue on Wednesday, August 26, and Thursday, August 27, 2026 if needed. The hearing, which will be held in the Commission's hearing room, will be open to the public and broadcast live on the Commission website. The Commission will also publish a Notice of Hearing on its website and in local newspapers.

In accordance with Rule 22 of the Commission's *Rules of Practice & Procedure*, the Commission may reject any documents, evidence or written submissions that are not filed in accordance with these timelines.

The Commission may also adjust or supplement the timelines and procedures set out herein to ensure that this Application proceeds in an efficient, timely and procedurally fair manner.
