The Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission (the “Commission”), in its review of the 2025 Rate Application submitted by St. Peters Bay Sewage Collection and Treatment Corporation (the “Utility”), requests responses to the following interrogatories in order to assess the proposed rate increases.

Forecast & Revenue Integrity

17. In the interrogatory responses submitted July 27, 2026, it was noted that “Other Revenue” includes charges to UPEI Climate Change, St. Peter’s Complex, and the Department of Housing and Seniors, and that these units were categorized as “Other Revenue” because they were added after the last rate adjustment.
 - a. For clarity, please explain why these charges are being reported under “Other Revenue” rather than being combined with “Flat-rate Revenue”.

General & Application Clarification

18. In the interrogatory responses submitted June 15, 2026, the Utility confirmed that it did not wish to revise the proposed effective date of December 1, 2025 for the rate increase. It was further noted that the Utility bills semi-annually—issuing invoices in May and October—and that revised rates would be applied at the next billing cycle following Commission approval. As the Utility bills for the service period being invoiced, no separate retroactive billing process was proposed. Please provide the following clarification:

- a. Please clarify why a December 1, 2025 effective date is being requested when the annual billing cycle runs January 1 to December 31.
- b. As you have indicated that revised rates would be implemented at the next billing cycle following Commission approval, please confirm that you do not intend to apply retroactive billing for the period December through June (if approved). If this understanding is incorrect, please clarify.

Additional interrogatories may follow. Please provide responses to the Commission by **August 11, 2026**.
