Good afternoon,

I hope you're well. I would like to provide my personal feedback regarding PEI's Energy Future, and the proposed plan by Maritime Electric to build two 50 megawatt diesel combustion turbines in PEI.

I strongly **OPPOSE** and **DISAGREE** with this proposal, as I feel that there are better and more sustainable options to secure a stronger energy future for our province, and the next generations.

There are other options out there, including ones that are more affordable as proven by the report prepared by IRAC's own energy expert teams. The number one recommended alternative for PEI is a Battery Energy Storage System. 100 MW of BESS can provide the same power and reliability to the province, with significantly lower installation and operating costs (capital costs of \$240 Million compared to \$371 Million, as proposed by Maritime Electric for their diesel turbines).

Also the commercial owner and support of these turbines would not be local, as they are based in the United States, which again to me would not be as safe or sustainable to depend on for future generations; we need to have more control, and have those responsible for supporting our energy supply closer to home.

Our family lives in Stratford, with two young children (10 and 5 years old), and we work in Charlottetown and Belfast. We would like to believe that we can do better for our children, and the future population of our province, by investing in more locally owned and environmentally friendly options than continuing down a dependent cycle on fossil fuel energy generation.
