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# Order

**BACKGROUND:**

1. On June 20, 2022, Maritime Electric Company, Limited (“Maritime Electric”) filed an application with the Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission (the “Commission”) seeking approval of rates, tolls and charges for electric service for the three year period from March 1, 2023 to February 28, 2026 (the “Application”).
2. Following receipt of the Application, the Commission gave public notice through a publication in local newspapers and on the Commission website. In the notice, the Commission invited interested parties to request intervener status, in accordance with the Commission’s Rules of Practice & Procedure. Requests for intervention were to be submitted by August 26, 2022.
3. On August 25, 2022, the Commission received a request for intervention on behalf of the Prince Edward Island Energy Corporation (“PEIEC”). PEIEC requests to be recognized as an Added Party Intervener with respect to the Application.
4. In support of its request, PEIEC states that it is a Crown corporation that, among other things, owns and operates wind farms and transmission facilities in the Province and finances energy projects. PEIEC submits that taxpayers of Prince Edward Island could be adversely affected by the outcome of the Application, and that PEIEC has a direct and substantial role to play in representing the public interest.
5. PEIEC also explained that it intends to actively participate in the Application.
6. Maritime Electric, as the applicant, does not oppose PEIEC’s request to intervene in the Application.

**DECISION:**

7. The Commission has reviewed the request for intervener status filed by PEIEC and is satisfied that PEIEC has a distinct and substantial interest in the Application and intends to participate actively in the proceeding. As a result, the Commission approves the request for Added Party Intervener status as filed on behalf of PEIEC.

The Commission Orders:

1. The request for intervener status is approved, and the Prince Edward Island Energy Corporation is granted Added Party Intervener status with respect to the Application.
