AND UPON it appearing to the Commission that:

- 1) No change in the regular gasoline prices currently in effect in both the dealer and consumer schedules:
- 2) No change in the premium gasoline prices currently in effect in both the dealer and consumer schedules:
- 3) A decrease in the diesel prices currently in effect in both the dealer and consumer schedules of 1.0 cents per litres (cpl); and
- 4) A decrease in the furnace fuel and stove oil prices currently in effect in the consumer schedules of 2.0 cpl;

will result in prices that are just and reasonable;

- 3. the attached dealer prices, with H.S.T. added, shall be indicated on all documents accompanying deliveries of these products; and
- 4. the prices determined in this Order, with adjustments resulting from tax changes only, shall remain in effect until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

 - (a) to appeal the decision of the Commission to the Court of Appeal; and
 - (b) to participate as a party in the hearing of an appeal.
