## PETROLEUM PRICING

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, January 2, 2026 – The Prince Edward Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission approved the following petroleum prices effective 12:01 a.m., Friday, January 2, 2026:

- The price of regular gasoline will not change;
- The price of premium gasoline will not change;
- The price of diesel will decrease by 2.0 cpl; and
- The price of furnace oil will increase by 3.0 cpl.

Including taxes, pump prices for regular unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 137.0 to 138.1 cpl, prices for premium unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 143.9 to 145.0 cpl and prices for diesel will range from 165.9 to 167.1 cpl.

The maximum price for furnace oil is 123.1 cpl.

The Commission would like to advise dealers and consumers that it has noted the recent change in New Brunswick's pricing methodology, where the pricing formula has been adjusted to reflect the widespread availability of ethanol-blended product. As a result, a price reduction has been observed in New Brunswick, as these blended products are freely available across the province. The Commission is monitoring these changes closely and will be reviewing product availability in Prince Edward Island as part of its 2026 petroleum margin review.
