PETROLEUM PRICING

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, April 11, 2026 – The Prince Edward Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission approved the following petroleum prices effective 12:01 a.m., Saturday, April 11, 2026:

- The price of regular gasoline will decrease by 4.0 cents per litre (cpl);
- The price of premium gasoline will decrease by 4.0 cpl;
- The price of diesel will decrease by 5.0 cpl; and
- The price of furnace oil will decrease by 5.0 cpl.

Including taxes, pump prices for regular unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 193.7 to 194.8 cpl, prices for premium unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 205.2 to 206.3 cpl and prices for diesel will range from 250.6 to 251.7 cpl.

The maximum price for furnace oil is 188.1 cpl.

The Commission would like to advise consumers that while there have been decreases in market prices observed mid-week, market conditions remain volatile because of geopolitical conflicts. Part of the Commission's job when it sets the price of gas is to ensure a steady, reliable supply of fuel and price stability and fairness for both consumers and wholesalers/retailers.

The Commission would also like to remind consumers that market price is not the only factor that must be considered by the Commission when setting the price of gasoline each week. The Commission must also consider things like year-to-date margins, averages, and the general trends of market prices. These factors are reflected in the price that is set. The Commission continues to monitor these conditions daily to ensure that prices are fair for consumers and wholesalers/retailers and that consistent supply is available across the province.
