PETROLEUM PRICING

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, May 5, 2026 – The Prince Edward Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission approved the following petroleum prices effective 12:01 a.m., Tuesday, May 5, 2026:

- There will be an increase of 3.0 cents per litre (cpl) in the price of regular gasoline;
- There will be an increase of 4.5 cpl in the price of premium gasoline;
- There will be no change in the price of diesel; and
- There will be no change in the price of furnace oil.

Including taxes, pump prices for regular unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 200.0 to 201.1 cpl, prices for premium unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 208.6 to 209.8 cpl and prices for diesel at self-serve outlets will range from 231.0 to 232.2 cpl.

The maximum price for furnace oil is 172.3 cpl.

The Commission would like to advise consumers that market conditions remain volatile. The Commission continues to monitor these conditions daily to ensure that prices are fair for consumers and wholesalers/retailers and that consistent supply is available across the province.

Below is a chart showing the year-over-year comparison of fuel prices, including a comparison between the price of Brent Crude today and this time last year.
