### PETROLEUM PRICING

Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, June 9, 2026 – The Prince Edward Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission approved the following petroleum prices effective 12:01 a.m., Tuesday, June 9, 2026:

- There will be an increase of 2.5 cents per litre (“cpl”) in the price of regular gasoline;
- There will be an increase of 1.0 cpl in the price of premium gasoline;
- There will be no change in the price of diesel; and
- There will be an increase of 1.5 cpl in the price of furnace oil.

Including taxes, pump prices for regular unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 189.1 to 190.2 cpl, prices for premium unleaded gasoline at self-serve outlets will range from 198.8 to 200.0 cpl and prices for diesel at self-serve outlets will range from 221.8 to 223.0 cpl.

The maximum price for furnace oil is 161.8 cpl.

The Commission would like to advise consumers that market conditions remain volatile. The Commission continues to monitor these conditions daily to ensure that prices are fair for consumers and wholesalers/retailers and that consistent supply is available across the province.
